## Walking to Anne of Cleves House from Lewes Station

This walk takes roughly 8 minutes and is on flat pathways.

Walk out of the front of Lewes Station onto Station Road. Turn left towards the roundabout.

Before the roundabout use the crossing to walk onto the right hand side of the road.

Turn right at the roundabout and continue to the next mini roundabout. Cross straight over the mini roundabout and continue onto Southover High Street where Anne of Cleves House will be on your right.



# Walking to Amberley Museum from Amberley Station

The walk takes roughly 5 minutes on one path. Amberley Station is an unmanned station which means there are no staff to help you.

There is step free access from platform 2 **ONLY** so make sure you check which platform you are arriving on prior to travelling.

Walk out of the main exit from platform 2 of Amberley Station and cross Station Road.

Pass through the gate. Follow the flat path down all the way to the main ticket office at the Museum entrance.

## Walking to Fishbourne Roman Palace from Fishbourne Station

The walk takes roughly 10 minutes to walk on flat pavements and you will need to cross a few roads. Fishbourne Station is an unmanned station which means there are no staff to help you.

Leave the station from either platform 1 or 2. Turn right onto Salthill Road and continue until you reach the traffic lights.

Using the pedestrian crossing, cross over to the left hand side of Salthill Road and continue onwards until you see the brown sign for the Roman Palace.

Follow in the direction of the sign and turn left onto Roman Way. Continue on Roman Way, passing Fishbourne Primary School on your left until you reach the Museum.

## Walking to Bexhill Museum from Bexhill Station

This walk takes roughly 15 minutes on flat pavements and you will need to cross several roads.

Walk out of the front entrance of the station. Turn right and cross over Endwell Road and continue down to the end of Sea Road.

Turn right at the bottom of Sea Road onto Marina Road, continue past the De La Warr Pavilion on your left.

Cross over the roundabout onto Edgerton Road. Continue until you reach Bexhill Museum on your right.

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

SHOREHAM-BY-SEA STATION

#### Walking to Marlipins Museum from Shoreham-By-Sea Station

This walk is roughly 10 minutes on flat pavements and you will need to cross some roads

Walk out of the main entrance of Shoreham-By-Sea Station. Turn right and walk to the end of the road and then turn left onto Brunswick Road.

Walk to the end of Brunswick Road. When you get to the Methodist Church, cross over the road and turn right on to St Marys Road.

Just before you reach the graveyard, turn left onto East Street and continue to the High Street which runs along the River Adur. Turn right and keep walking until you reach Middle Street, where the Museum will be on your right.

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
